RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Andrew Kane, Chief of Police, wishing to replace police vehicles on a timely basis, wants permission of the Tribal Council to allow the Chairman of the White Mountain Apache Tribe to enter into contract with the General Service Administration and the Bureau of Indian Affairs to procure police vehicles; and
- WHEREAS, such contracts will take one year to put into place, due to timelines for the GSA to budget for the vehicles; and
- WHEREAS, GSA will charge a monthly use fee and mileage, which will allow for initial purchase, maintenance and fuel costs for the vehicle; and
- WHEREAS, vehicles will be automatically replaced after 54,000 miles, resulting in lower operating costs to the Tribe.
- BEIT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby authorizes the Chairman of the Tribal Council to execute all documents necessary to contract with the GSA for the procurement of Police vehicles beginning in Fiscal Year 1997.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>May 03, 1995</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>nine</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (b), (i), (k), (s), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
