RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has received recurrent complaints from tribal members that they are on a long waiting list for HUD mutual help homes, or that they have not been selected for a home; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is aware that HUD Indian Programs has a selection procedure;
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council would benefit if the Phoenix HUD Indian Program's office, in conjunction with the Phoenix Area Office of the Bureau of Indian Affairs and the Tribal Land Board, would conduct a workshop for the Tribal Council on the federal housing selection process, land assignments, and BIA policy in respect to Indian housing and selection of eligible applicants for same.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs the Tribal Housing Authority Director to make immediate inquiry to arrange a workshop for the Tribal Council by the Phoenix HUD Indian Housing Program Department on the Indian mutual help housing selection process.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it requests the Phoenix Area Office of the Bureau of Indian Affairs to participate in this training to the extent that office is involved in Indian housing and the selection process as well as the Tribal Land Office in regards to land assignments and its selection criteria for homesites.

The foregoing resolution was on June 7, 1995, duly adopted by a vote of nine for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (h), (i), (s), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
