RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is advised that the White Mountain Apache Tribal Police Department has been invited to participate in the "Safe-Trails" Program to train with the FBI at Quantico, Virginia, and to otherwise receive funds for travel and training; and
- WHEREAS, said program would team FBI agents with tribal criminal investigators and would concentrate on sex crime investigation and gang related crimes; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is requested to allow the participation of BIA Fort Apache Agency criminal investigators in the Safe-Trails Program on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that the Safe-Trails Program would be a valuable component of the Whiteriver Police Department's law enforcement responsibilities to the White Mountain Apache people; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council welcomes the participation of the Fort Apache Agency Bureau of Indian Affairs criminal investigators in the Safe-Trails Program, to be sponsored by the White Mountain Apache Tribe and the Federal Bureau of Investigation.
- **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby accepts the invitation from the U.S. Attorney's Office to participate in the Safe-Trails Program with the Federal Bureau of Investigation.
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council that it hereby authorizes the Fort Apache Agency Bureau of Indian Affairs criminal investigators to participate in the Safe-Trails Program with the Whiteriver Police Department.
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council that it hereby authorizes the Tribal Chairman, and in his absence the Vice Chairman, or their respective designees, to sign any and all documents necessary to participate in the FBI Safe-Trails Program.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>August 03, 1995</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>NINE</u> for and <u>ZERO</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (b), (i), (j), (s), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
