

**RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

WHEREAS, Tribal Member Myrtle Gass (Bragg) has come before the Tribal Council to advise that she has been the single operator of a saw shop operating beside J&B Auto for the past two years; and

WHEREAS, she is accompanied by her husband, Joe Bragg; and

WHEREAS, she is requesting recognition from the Tribal Council that she be allowed to continue to operate the saw shop; and

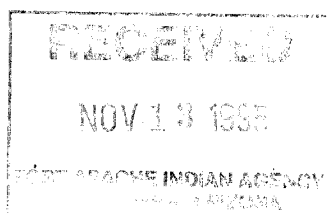
WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is advised that she is subleasing space next to J&B Auto from Beverly Lupe Townsend who has the original lease between the Tribe and J&B Auto; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council explains to Mrs. Bragg that the sublease between her business and J&B Auto was not approved by the Tribal Council, but that they wish to recognize her as the operator of the saw shop pending further negotiations with her regarding a business lease with the Tribe and pending resolving lease issues with Beverly Lupe Townsend and her spouse, Jack Townsend, who does business as J&B Auto.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby acknowledges and recognizes Myrtle Gass (Bragg) as the sole operator of the saw shop currently doing business next to J&B Auto.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby permits Myrtle Gass (Bragg) to continue operation of the saw shop pending further negotiations of a business site lease with her and resolution of pending lease issues with J&B Auto.

The foregoing resolution was on October 11, 1995 duly adopted by a vote of ten for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (i), (m), (n), (s), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
