## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Geraldine Alsenay has come before the Tribal Council with a request that she be given ownership of a house in McNary located at 211 Spruce Street; and
- WHEREAS, Ms. Alsenay explains to the Council that the former owner, Eric Metz, gave the house back to McNary Housing and that she has occupied the home and performed improvements for four years; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is concerned that there be no conflicting claims to the home and that Eric Metz has truly relinquished legal ownership of the home; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that Ms. Alsenay should obtain a letter from the prior owner of the home, Eric Metz, to the effect that he intends to transfer the home to her and that she provide whatever legal documentation is required for said transfer, and that if Ms. Alsenay obtains legal transfer of the home, the Council would have no objection to her occupying the home as her own.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves granting the home at 211 Spruce Street to Geraldine Alsenay on the condition that she first obtain legal title to the home from the previous owner, if said owner is willing, and that proof of said legal transfer be provided to the Tribal Council.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>December 6, 1995</u> duly adopted by a vote of <u>ten</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (h), (i), (m), (s), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
