## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council established the Tribal Employment Rights Office (TERO) to regulate employment within and near the Reservation; and
- WHEREAS, a Board of Commissioners has been used by the TERO to resolve labor and employment disputes, and to help promulgate TERO regulations; and
- WHEREAS, the new draft of the TERO ordinance establishes and authorizes a TERO Board to undertake specific responsibilities; and
- WHEREAS, the new draft is under review and has not been enacted into law; and
- WHEREAS, there is no authorization in the current TERO ordinance to establish a TERO Board, or for such a board to assume official responsibilities.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby disbands the TERO Board.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that upon the enactment of Tribal law authorizing a TERO Board, it shall appoint such a board to carry out the duties as established in the ordinance.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it extends its sincere gratitude to the current Board members for their service and valued contributions to the TERO department.

## Resolution No. 01-96-008

The foregoing resolution was on January 10, 1996, duly adopted by a vote of ten for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by the White Mountain Apache Tribal Constitution, including Article IV, Sections 1(a), (s), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
