RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is advised that the HIP Housing Project for Tribal member Johnny James is presently being delayed for unknown reasons and that construction has begun on the home, but has not been completed; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is advised that Mr. James is apprehensive that because of the home's incomplete stage of construction it will be subject to vandalism and; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council wishes to receive an explanation as to why the home has not been completed and desires that the home be completed as soon as possible without further delay.
- **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs the Director of the HIP Project to expedite completion of the HIP home for Tribal Member Johnny James.
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council that it hereby directs the Director of the HIP Project to provide an explanation to the Tribal Chairman and Tribal Council as to why Johnny James' HIP Project home has not been completed to date.

The foregoing resolution was on March 13, 1996 duly adopted by a vote of eight for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (h), (i), (s), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
