RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Cedar Creek is a community that has suffered from degradation of its streams and watershed due to a long history of mismanagement by the Federal Government and insufficient resources to protect sensitive areas; and
- WHEREAS, many tribal elders remember Cedar Creek as a virtual Garden of Eden, teeming with migratory birds, cottonwood, willows, reeds, and fruit trees; and
- WHEREAS, several projects in Cedar Creek have vividly demonstrated the potential of this area to recover through reduced pressure from livestock grazing; and
- WHEREAS, the Arizona Water Protection Fund has been established to maintain and restore waters in the State of Arizona, and the Tribe is currently implementing two major restoration projects with funds from that valuable sources; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe, with assistance from the Arizona Water Protection Fund, has valuable opportunity to restore Cedar Creek to its former condition and educate both tribal members and visitors about the significance of this special place; and
- WHEREAS, the proposed restoration project will include improved livestock management in riparian areas, the development of a riparian/watershed management plan. and the development of an educational program for the community, schools, and visitors to the project.
- **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby authorizes the submission of an application to fund a project for the restoration of Cedar Creek, including extensive tribal staff contributions of technical and planning assistance.
