

**RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

WHEREAS, Dustinn Craig, a participant in the Healthy Nations Program, has come before the Tribal Council this date and explained to the Council the sport of skate boarding and to advise the Tribal Council that September 28, 1996, has been designated as Play Day by Health Nations, which will provide a drug free youth day where all sports, including a skate boarding contest will be promoted and participated in by the youth of the Reservation; and


WHEREAS, Mr. Craig requests that the Tribal Council appropriate tribal funds to assist in the construction of a portable skate board facility; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Craig further advises the Council that there are many young tribal members on the Reservation that have achieved a great deal of skill in skate boarding and that it is a healthy and wholesome outlet of youthful energy and enable the participants to feel a sense of pride and accomplishment; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that it will match the contribution made by Healthy Nations Program for construction of a portable skate board facility in order to enhance the development of the sport within the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby authorizes a tribal fund match equal to the contribution made by Healthy Nations Program for construction of a portable skate board facility for use within the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

The foregoing resolution was on September 12, 1996 duly adopted by a vote of nine for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (h), (i), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
