## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS.

the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe has authorized the development of a new cultural education facility and museum at Fort Apache; and

WHEREAS,

the White Mountain Apache Tribe has hired a Museum Director to assist the Tribe with the professional development of the new facility; and

WHEREAS,

the long term maintenance of the facility will require the development of a new organizational structure for the support of Apache Culture Center and Museum programs; and

WHEREAS,

the Museum Assessment Program of the American Association of Museums provides assistance to museums by selecting professional consultants from similar types of museums to assess the museum's needs and help establish goals; and

WHEREAS,

the American Association of Museums will pay the consultant and provide travel funds for the consultant to travel to the museum.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby authorizes the Apache Culture Center and Museum to apply for MAP I grant funds and provide food and housing for the museum consultant during their visits to the Apache Culture Center and Museum.

The foregoing resolution was on October 03, 1996, duly adopted by a vote of ten for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by the White Mountain Apache Tribal Constitution, including Article IV, Sections 1 (a), (b), (g), (s), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
