## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe Game and Fish Department has come before the Tribal Council with the proposal to begin a spring gobbler turkey hunt; and
- WHEREAS, the proposed hunt will generate income for the Tribe and develop use of tribal natural resources in a responsible manner; and
- WHEREAS, the turkey population within the Reservation is more than adequate to sustain the proposed hunt.
- **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves the gobbler hunt proposal attached to this Resolution and submitted by the Game and Fish Department for implementation the spring of 1997.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>January 8, 1997</u> duly adopted by a vote of <u>eight</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (f), (h), (i), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on September 30, 19933, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

Season Dates: April 19 - May 10, 1997

**Bag Limit:** 1 Bearded Turkey per season

**Cost:** \$750.00 for 4 day hunt

\$2000.00 for a 7 day combination Turkey/Bear

**Number of Permits:** 40

All nonmember spring gobbler hunts will be run through the Wildlife and Outdoor Recreation Division. Hunts will include guide, food, and lodging at the Maverick Elk Camp. Department personnel will guide as part of their regular job duties with no additional pay.
