RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has been successful in obtaining some assistance from Navajo County for housing and other tribal community needs; and
- WHEREAS, the Fort Apache Indian Reservation of the White Mountain Apache Tribe encompasses portions of Gila County and Apache County, as well; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that a special sub-committee of the Tribal Council comprised of Councilmen Lynn Cody, Romeo Dazen, and Herbert Tate should be appointed and authorized to pursue funding from Gila County for housing and other community needs on the Reservation, and to determine if such funding is available from Gila County.
- **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby appoints Councilmembers Lynn Cody, Romeo Dazen, and Herbert Tate to inquire of Gila County the availability of funding for housing and other community needs for reservation communities that lie within Gila County.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>February 5, 1997</u> duly adopted by a vote of <u>nine</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by the White Mountain Apache Tribe Constitution, including Article IV, Section 1 (a), (i), (j), (s), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
