

**RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**


**WHEREAS,** the Carrizo community has presented a petition to the Tribal Council for permission to utilize Carrizo land claims funds for a trip to the Phoenix Zoo and IMAX on May 10, 1997 for tribal member children from the Carrizo community; and

**WHEREAS,** the petition is attached to this resolution and incorporated by reference herein; and

**WHEREAS,** the Tribal Council agrees with the request and the petition.

**BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves the expenditure of Carrizo community land claims funds to finance a trip to the Phoenix Zoo and IMAX on May 10, 1997 for Carrizo children, estimated to be approximately \$1,149 which will cover the admission fees and meals for 46 children and 4 chaperones for the Zoo and IMAX.

The foregoing resolution was on April 11, 1997 duly adopted by a vote of nine for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by the White Mountain Apache Tribe Constitution, including Article IV, Section 1 (a), (i), (k), (s), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
