RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, lower speed limits in school areas is necessary for the safety of school children; and
- WHEREAS, there are presently no 15 mile per hour speed limit signs at the East Fork Mission School and Seven Mile Elementary School; and
- WHEREAS, said schools are on BIA roads and the Bureau of Indian Affairs is the appropriate agency for the Tribal Council to request that 15 mile per hour speed limit signs be posted at the two school locations.
- **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby places the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Fort Apache Agency, on notice that there are presently no speed limit signs at these two locations and that it is critical that the speed limit signs be posted immediately to ensure the safety of children attending the two schools.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby requests that the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Fort Apache Agency, install and post 15 mile per hour speed limit signs at the East For Mission School and Seven Mile Elementary School, both of which are located on BIA roads.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>April 9, 1997</u> duly adopted by a vote of <u>eight</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by the White Mountain Apache Tribe Constitution, including Article IV, Section 1 (a), (c), (i), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
