## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, The Indian Health Service has announced a request for proposals for Tribal Demonstration Grants for Child Protection and Child Abuse Prevention; and
- WHEREAS, these grants will offer funds up to \$150,000 per year up to a possible maximum of five years for eight tribes; and
- WHEREAS, Apache Behavioral Health Services has formulated a service program to address the needs of children and families at risk for abuse congruent with the grant requirements; and
- WHEREAS, Apache Behavioral Health Services is prepared to submit this program on behalf of the White Mountain Apache Tribe to the Indian Health Services for consideration as a Demonstration Grant; and
- WHEREAS, grant funds would be controlled by the Tribe and the program would be supervised by tribal personnel under Tribal Health Authority utilizing standard tribal grants and contracts policies; and
- WHEREAS, the grant funds and program would be of great benefit to the Tribe and its members.
- **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby endorses the submission of Apache Behavioral Health Services' grant proposal to the Indian Health Service for consideration as a Demonstration Grant under Billing Code: 4160-16.

The foregoing resolution was on May 15, 1997, duly adopted by a vote of seven for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by the White Mountain Apache Tribal Constitution, including Article IV, Sections 7 (a), (b), (i), (j), (k), (s), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
