RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Game and Fish Department has come before the Tribal Council this date and explained in detail to the Tribal Council a proposed wildlife study project involving predator management in two specific study areas identified to the Tribal Council; and
- WHEREAS, the wildlife study predator management proposal has been distributed to the Tribal Council this date; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concurs in the recommendations of the Tribal Game and Fish Department that a wildlife study be conducted to evaluate the effectiveness of predator control alternatives to improve ungular populations for deer and antelope on the White Mountain Apache Indian Reservation.
- **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby authorizes the Game and Fish Department to proceed with its projected wildlife study for predator management with the objective of improving antelope and deer herd populations on the White Mountain Indian Reservation.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>August 6, 1997</u> duly adopted by a vote of <u>Seven</u> for and <u>Zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (b), (f), (i), (j), (q), (s), (t), and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
