RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is advised that Earl Logging has granted a raise to its employees, but that Tribal Members in Earl Logging's employment did not receive raises equal to that given to Non-Indian employees of Earl Logging; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council believes that Earl Logging should grant raises to Tribal Member employees equal to those granted by Earl Logging to Non-Indian employees and that they should be paid the same rate of pay for like work and position.
- **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs Earl Logging to adjust the pay raises given to Tribal Member and non-member employees so that Tribal Member raises are equal to the raises paid by Earl Logging to Non-Indian employees for like positions and work.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>September 10, 1997</u> duly adopted by a vote of <u>nine</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (i), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
