## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is advised that Ron Etheridge of Citizens Telephone Company has requested Tribal Council permission to install a two-way radio at the seven-mile facility maintained by Navopache Electric so that Citizens is able to keep in radio contact with its installation and maintenance vehicle; and
- WHEREAS, Citizen's has requested permission to be at the site for the duration of Navopache's lease or right of way and that there be no charge to Citizens for the use because it will improve service to the Whiteriver vicinity; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is advised that technical consultant Don Wise has advised the legal department that there would be no interference or other technical problems with the use of that frequency at that location.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby grants permission to Citizens Telecom to install a two-way radio on seven mile hill for the purposes stated in this resolution with the understanding that such use can be terminated at any time if the Council determines that it would be in the best interest of the White Mountain Apache Tribe to do so.

The foregoing resolution was on November 6, 1997 duly adopted by a vote of eight for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (b) (e), (i), (m), (t), and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
