RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, December 5, 1997 is the first day that candidates for the 1998 Primary and General Election may request nomination petitions; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council as a matter of fairness to all candidates for Chairman, Vice-Chairman and eligible Tribal Council offices has declared a moratorium on any Tribal Council Member reports on the Tribal Radio Station, KNNB FM; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that no candidate for an office on the Tribal Council or any candidate supporters or a person speaking on behalf of said candidate should be permitted to campaign, make speeches, or appear on KNNB in support of said candidate or speak against any other candidate from December 3, 1997 to the date of the Inauguration.
- **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby prohibits any candidate, non-candidate council member, candidate for Tribal Council office or supporter thereof to appear on KNNB radio and speak on behalf of any candidate or against any candidate for the time period December 3, 1997 to the date of inauguration of May 6, 1998.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>December 3, 1997</u> duly adopted by a vote of <u>ten</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (i), (q), (s), (t), and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
