RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Tribal Member Kino Torino has come before the Tribal Council this date and advises the Council that there are severe problems with inoperative or leaking septic tanks in the East Fork-Turkey Creek area; and
- WHEREAS, Mr. Torino explains that his parents are having sewage problems and he has been working with Indian Health Service to resolve those problems; and
- WHEREAS, he requests on behalf of the East Fork-Turkey Creek communities that the Tribal Council direct Indian Health Service, Office of Environmental Health to continue with sewer line construction in the East Fork-Turkey Creek area for health, safety, and sanitation reasons as the septic tanks are old and can no longer accommodate the sewage.
- **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby requests that the Indian Health Service, Office of Environmental Health, expedite the extension of sewer lines in the East Fork-Turkey Creek area to alleviate health problems associated with inadequate septic tanks.
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council that it requests the Indian Health Service. Office of Environmental Health to report back to the Tribal Council, and to the Office of the Tribal Chairman its time line for the extension of sewer lines in the East Fork-Turkey Creek area.

The foregoing resolution was on March 4, 1998 duly adopted by a vote of eight for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (i), (j), (s), (t), and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
