RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Edmund and Rosalind Altaha have requested financial assistance from the Tribal Council to allow their son Joseph, an eighth grade student at JFK Middle School and a member of the Whiteriver Assembly of God Church, to travel to the country of Romania on a church mission where the teaching of the bible is almost unheard of; and
- WHEREAS, Joseph will be traveling to Romania in July of this year with other young missionaries; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council advises Mrs. Altaha that the Tribe has customarily offered \$500 for Student athletes to travel to Australia and Hawaii and that it is willing to provide the same assistance to her son Joseph to help pay for the cost of his missionary trip to Romania.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby authorizes the payment of \$500 in Tribal funds to the family of Edmund and Rosalind Altaha to help pay for their son Joseph's Christian mission to the country of Romania in 1998; said funds to be appropriated from the same funds previously authorized to provide financial assistance to student athletes traveling overseas or to Hawaii.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>April 8, 1998</u> duly adopted by a vote of <u>ten</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (i), (k), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
