WHEREAS, a Tribal member Kenna Tessay was selected as a 1998 F.H.A./Kikkoman Corporation Scholarship recipient for the summer to Japan, and has come before the Tribal Council requesting financial assistance from the Tribe, and

WHEREAS, Tribal Council is agreeable to donating \$500.00 to Kenna Tessay for purpose stated.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby authorizes the expenditure of \$500.00 from the Hondah Casino Education Fund to assist Kenna Tessay in the amount of \$500.00 for travel expenses to Japan where she will be a representative of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

The foregoing resolution was on June 8, 1998, duly adopted by a vote of six for and zero against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (b), (h), (i), and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

Congratulations! I am happy to bring you and your family the good news of your selection as a 1998 F.H.A./Kikkoman Corporation scholarship recipient for the Summer to Japan. We have reviewed your admissions paperwork, and can confirm your enrollment to the Youth For Understanding (YFU) International Exchange program. To welcome you to YFU, we are happy to present you with a YFU T-shirt. You will also find enclosed your American Overseas Student and Parent Handbooks. These handbooks contain important information about the YFU program and your exchange experience and will answer many of your questions. Be sure to read them thoroughly!

Throughout the time remaining until your departure, YFU will be sending you important materials and information about your program. Your YFU Regional Office will send information on your pre-departure orientation, which is mandatory for all students and will include a special session for parents. Approximately one to two months before you leave, we will send information on international and domestic travel arrangements. Between now and your departure date you can watch for regular mailings from our International Center which will cover various important topics related to living abroad.

Meanwhile, we will forward the information contained in your Admissions Packet to the YFU National Office in Japan, and they will begin selecting an appropriate host family for you. This process is done very carefully, so we may not receive information on your placement until very shortly before your departure. We will send you the name and address of the host family as soon as we receive the information from our office overseas. Should the placement occur within two weeks prior to departure, we will either telephone or send a mailgram to ensure that you have the information before departure.

As you count down the days until the departure, there are many things for you to do. If you have not already done so, OBTAIN YOUR PASSPORT immediately! (If you are not a U.S. citizen, make sure you have discussed this with me as you may need to get a visa.) In addition, your enrollment is conditional upon YFU's receipt signatures for forms A2 and B. Copies of your forms are enclosed. Please sign and return the forms to me upon receipt of this letter.
