RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe as the governing body of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is vitally concerned about the health and welfare of its Tribal members; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is aware of the need to improve the dietary patterns of Apache people and desires to obtain an expansion on fresh produce to the existing USDA Commodity Food Program; and
- WHEREAS, the families depending on the commodities at this time do not get fresh produce through this program; and
- **WHEREAS**, the expansion of the Fresh Produce Program to the existing USDA Commodity Food Program represents an excellent opportunity to positively impact the dietary practices of the White Mountain Apache people.
- **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby supports the expansion of fresh produce under the existing USDA Commodity Food Program.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>August 13, 1998</u> duly adopted by a vote of <u>six</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (j), (t), and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
