RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, White Mountain Apache Housing Authority has received funding in the amount of \$348,140 through the HUD Drug Elimination Program; and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority, the White Mountain Apache Healthy Nations and the Whiteriver Police Department have met to arrange for the planned programs to utilize the funds in accordance with the grant; and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority desires to contract with the Tribe for additional police services to create a drug and crime free environment and to provide for the safety and protection of the residents in its public housing developments; and
- WHEREAS, the funding provides for reimbursement of law enforcement in the amount of \$262,240 and drug prevention in the amount of \$85,900; and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority proposes to enter into a Contract with the White Mountain Apache Tribe, in the form attached hereto, to provide police services in accordance with the Drug Elimination Program funding.
- **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves the attached contract between the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority and the White Mountain Apache Tribe to provide police services through the Whiteriver Police Department in accordance with the terms and conditions of the contract.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby authorizes the Chairman of the Tribal Council, or in his absence, the Vice-Chairman, to execute the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority Contract for the Provision of Supplemental Police Services, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof.
