

**RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

WHEREAS, the Health Authority Director, Donna Vigil, and Health Authority Volunteer, Susanne Kempf, have come before the Tribal Council this date to request that Ms. Kempf be granted permission to conduct a study on domestic violence via a video presentation; and

WHEREAS, this video would be beneficial for the tribe as it would raise awareness of the negative effects of substance abuse and domestic violence on the family, especially children; and

WHEREAS, the format and content of the video will be the result of a collaboration between Healthy Nations and other institutions on the reservation that are addressing the issue of domestic violence; and

WHEREAS, it is understood that property rights belong to the tribe and any research shall be returned to the tribe for the benefit of the tribe; and


WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that it should grant approval to Susanne Kempf to conduct a study on domestic violence via a video presentation.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby grants Susanne Kempf permission to produce a video on domestic violence.

The foregoing resolution was on September 2, 1998, duly adopted by a vote of six for, zero against and one abstention by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Sections (a), (g), (h), (s) (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 2, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
