RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- **WHEREAS**, the members of the Tribal Council are committed to preventing diabetes, cancer and other chronic disease; and
- WHEREAS, diabetes and breast cancer prevention is a goal of Apache Diabetes Wellness Center; and
- **WHEREAS,** a goal of Healthy People 2000 is to have 60% women age 50 plus have mammogram every two years; and
- WHEREAS, only 10% of women age 50 plus of the White Mountain Apache Tribe have had a mammogram within the past two years; and
- WHEREAS, early detection of breast cancer increased the survival rate from 20% to 100%; and
- WHEREAS, the Apache Diabetes Wellness Center submitted a proposal and received a grant from the Susan P. Komen Foundation in the amount of \$11,826.00; and
- WHEREAS, the grant will pay for mammograms for women ages 40 plus that are not covered by Indian Health Service, Well Women Health Check and Tribal insurance; and
- WHEREAS, the indirect cost portion is excluded from the Susan P. Komen Foundation Grant.
- **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby agrees to waive the indirect cost for the Susan P. Komen Foundation Grant.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>February 5, 1999</u> duly adopted by a vote of <u>eight</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (b), (i), (j), (k), (s), (t), and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
