

**RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

**WHEREAS,** the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council has consistently endorsed initiatives to celebrate and conserve Apache culture and history; and

**WHEREAS,** President Clinton and the First Lady have established the *Millennium Council* and *Save America's Treasures* programs to promote awareness of history and culture as the foundation for a bright and progressive future for all Americans; and


**WHEREAS,** the White Mountain Apache Tribe has been invited to participate in these programs through designation as a Millennium Community; and

**WHEREAS,** Millennium Community designation will enhance White Mountain Apache Tribe eligibility to compete for diverse grants and to participate in community development programs.


**BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it authorizes and endorses the Tribe's participation in the President's and First Lady's Millennium Council.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it directs John R. Welch, Tribal Historic Preservation Officer to prepare and submit the Tribe's application for Millennium Community designation and to keep the Council apprized of opportunities that may be in the Tribe's best interest.

The foregoing resolution was on March 4, 1999 duly adopted by a vote of ten for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (g), (i), (j), (s), (t), and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
