


**RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**


- WHEREAS**, the Indian Health Service Sanitary Deficiency System (SDS) rankings are designed to annually assess Tribal water, wastewater treatment and solid waste management needs or deficiencies; and
- WHEREAS**, Indian Health Service funding for capital improvement projects for Tribal communities is based on SDS and its established point scoring system, where points are assigned and totaled based on criteria such as known health impact, capital cost, Tribal operations and maintenance capability, other contributions and Tribal priorities; and
- WHEREAS**, eighteen projects have been identified as needs on the Reservation but only three (3) projects rank highly enough to reach the likely national IHS/SDS funding level; and
- WHEREAS**, these projects are the following for the FY 1999 IHS/SDS ranking: 1) Whiteriver Regional Sewer System Study, 2) McNary Sewer Force Main Project, and 3) Whiteriver Regional Sewer System Constructed Wetlands Project; and
- WHEREAS**, committing zero (0) contribution points to each of these projects and contributing 16, 12 and 8 Tribal priority points to these projects, respectively in the order in which the projects are listed above, should provide for a high enough ranking to qualify projects 1 and 2 for funding; and
- WHEREAS**, projects 1 and 2, the Whiteriver Regional Sewer System Study and the McNary Sewer Force Main Project, respectively, are believed to be of the most critical need in terms of providing for future economic and community growth on the Reservation.
- BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves the ranking system and priorities shown on the attached Sanitary Deficiency System 1999 Listing table, and that it places its highest priorities as shown through assignment of Tribal priority points.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs Tribal and Indian Health Service staff to submit these projects and corresponding SDS rankings to the Indian Health Service for consideration for funding.

Resolution No. 05-99-97

The foregoing resolution was on May 6, 1999 duly adopted by a vote of six for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (b), (i), (j), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
