RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, it is recommended to the Tribal Council that the Bull Cienega Timber Sale be reopened for the purpose of capturing tree mortality from attacks of insect infestations; and
- WHEREAS, accumulations of dead material will create extreme fire hazards; and
- WHEREAS, accumulations of dead material will make it impenetrable for wildlife use; and
- WHEREAS, potential insect infestations could spread into the Sunrise Park Resort causing immeasurable economic loss to the Tribe, as well as posing extreme safety hazards to park visitors.
- **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Tribal Forestry and FATCO to remove the mortality in an environmentally sound manner, with consideration to sacred areas threatened and endangered species; and
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it rescinds Resolution No. <u>06-87-192</u> and hereby implements this new resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>July 15, 1999</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>SEVEN</u> for and <u>ZERO</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (c), (f), (h), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on September 30,1 993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
