
## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the week of May 14 through May 20, 2000 is recognized as National Police Week; and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe supports and operates a Law Enforcement Program within the boundaries of its Reservation; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council supports the work of all law enforcement officers, and in particular recognizes and supports the work by the Tribal Law Enforcement officers on behalf of the Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, during this past year one of the Tribe's Officers, Tenny Gatewood, Jr., lost his life while on duty due to a tragic shooting; and
- WHEREAS, this sad event demonstrates the sacrifice and commitment of our law enforcement officers on behalf of their community; and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe will recognize and participate in National Police Week to support law enforcement throughout this nation and to promote and support law enforcement within the lands of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.
- **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby recognizes National Police Week May 14 May 20, 2000 within the lands of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it supports activities to be held during National Police Week to support law enforcement, and it encourages all members of our community to participate in these events to show their respect and support for law enforcement.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby offers it utmost appreciation and gratitude to the uniformed officers of the Tribal police force for their services on behalf of the Tribe, and it again offers it utmost gratitude and condolences to the family of Officer Tenny Gatewood, Jr. for his sacrifice on behalf of his Tribe.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>May 8, 2000</u> duly adopted by a vote of <u>SIX</u> for and <u>ZERO</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (s), (t), and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
