

**RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

**WHEREAS**, on December 6, 1999, the Tribal Council adopted Resolution 12-99-299 pertaining to the collection of taxes from businesses within the Reservation, and in particularly the tax records of the Smoke Shop and Smoke Shop proprietor Ronnie Lupe; and

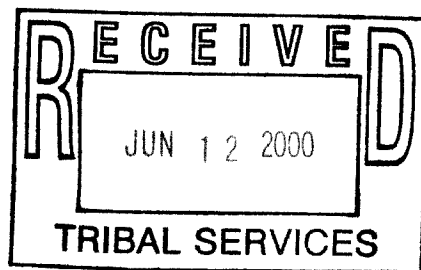
**WHEREAS**, the Tribal Council now concludes that such taxation information should be collected from all on-reservation businesses, pursuant to uniform tax regulations, and should not target one particular business operation; and

**WHEREAS**, the Tribal Council intends to rescind Resolution No. 12-99-299 in order to develop a fair and comprehensive tax policy applicable to all businesses within the Reservation.


**BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby rescinds Resolution No. 12-99-299.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs the development, for later Tribal Council review, of a strategy for reimplementing a fair and effective business tax structure to be applied to all businesses operating within the Tribe's Reservation.

The foregoing resolution was on June 2, 2000 duly adopted by a vote of SIX for and TWO against and ONE abstention by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (i), (o), (s), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
