

**RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council has the power to act in all matters that concern the welfare of the Tribe and its members; and

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe Social Service Department manages the White Mountain Apache Tribe Welfare to Work Program which is an arm of the Temporary Assistance to Needy Families program (TANF); and

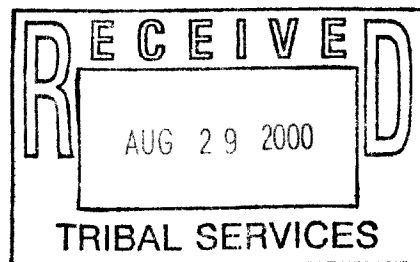
WHEREAS, the nature of services provided under the Welfare to Work Program require internal policies and procedures to direct staff and management on the proper operation of the program; and

WHEREAS, the Director of the TANF program has advised the Council of the purpose of the policies and procedures presented, and has discussed and answered questions thereon from the Council members; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council agrees that policies and procedures are necessary for the proper operation of the Welfare to Work Program to enable members of the White Mountain Apache Tribe to gain independence from the confines of welfare and government assistance.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves the Welfare to Work Program Policies and Procedures as presented this day.

The foregoing resolution was on August 2, 2000 duly adopted by a vote of SEVEN for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (s), (t), and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
