RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Rayleen I. Velasquez, as the legal guardian of tribal member Denray Devante Joe, dob: 07/21/1993, has requested that his tribal membership with the White Mountain Apache Tribe be relinquished so that he may become eligible for enrollment with the Navajo Nation; and
- WHEREAS, Rayleen I. Velasquez signed the necessary documents of relinquishment of head rights in the presence of a Notary Public on the 8th day of May, 2000, and are attached hereto; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Enrollment Committee approved this relinquishment request at their meeting on July 26, 2000.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby grants the tribal relinquishment request of Denray Devante Joe, and his tribal membership with the White Mountain Apache Tribe is relinquished as of this date along with any and all privileges accorded members of the White Mountain Apache Tribe such as, but not limited to hunting, fishing, and recreational privileges within the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs the Office of Vital Records to remove Denray Devante Joe from the membership rolls of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>February 22, 2001</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>SIX</u> for and <u>ZERO</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by the White Mountain Apache Tribal Constitution, including Article II, Section 2 and Article IV, Section 1 of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
