RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe has been advised by the Health Authority of the availability of funds through the Arizona Department of Health Services H2-018, the Health Facility Construction Program, to fund health care capital projects in Arizona-designated Medically Underserved Area (MUA); and
- WHEREAS, the purpose of these dollars is to fund capital projects resulting in expanded delivery of primary care or dental services to underserved populations; and
- WHEREAS, the Fort Apache Indian Reservation is an Arizona-designated Medically Underserved Area with significant need for expanded dental services for its population; and
- WHEREAS, up to \$350,000 will be sought through this grant program to purchase to purchase a state-of-the-art mobile dental unit to serve the primary dental needs of the White Mountain Apache Tribal members throughout the Reservation.
- **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby formally authorizes the Health Authority's application for funds through H2-018, the Health Facility Construction Program.

The foregoing resolution was on November 5, 2001 duly adopted by a vote of SIX for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (b), (j), (s), (t), and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
