RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Carlene (Massey) Narcho has requested that her daughter Tonweya Dawn Narcho's tribal membership with the White Mountain Apache Tribe be relinquished; and
- WHEREAS, Ms. Narcho is already enrolled with the Tohono Oodham Nation and wishes to remain on the rolls of the Tohono Oodham Nation; and
- WHEREAS, Carlene (Massey) Narcho signed the necessary documents of relinquishment of head rights in the presence of a Notary Public on the 9th day of September, 2001 and are attached hereto; and
- **WHEREAS**, the Tribal Enrollment Committee approved this relinquishment request at their meeting on October 2, 2001.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby grants the tribal relinquishment request of Tonweya Dawn Narcho, and her tribal membership with the White Mountain Apache Tribe is relinquished as of this date, along with any and all privileges accorded members of the White Mountain Apache Tribe such as, and not limited to, hunting, fishing, and recreational privileges within the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council that it hereby directs the Office of Vital Records to remove Tonweya Dawn Narcho from the membership rolls of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

The foregoing resolution was on November 14, 2001, duly adopted by a vote of SIX for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article II, Section 1 and Article IV, Section 1 of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
