

**RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Police Department reports that alcoholism and alcohol and substance abuse are the most severe health and social problems facing the White Mountain Apache Tribe; and

WHEREAS, nothing is more costly than the consequences of alcohol and substance abuse measured in physical, mental, social and economic terms; and

WHEREAS, the Police Department and other departments lack the needed resources to mobilize tribal communities to implement or enhance innovative, collaborative efforts to address public safety issues related to alcohol and substance abuse; and

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Police Department, in collaboration with the Department of Planning wishes to formulate a core planning team to identify and pursue grant opportunities to develop strategies and enhance existing ones that prevent, interdict and treat alcohol/drug use by tribal community members; and

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Police Department wishes to apply for funding under the Indian Alcohol and Substance Abuse Demonstration Program offered by the U.S. Department of Justice.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby recognizes the need for additional resources to combat Alcohol and Substance Abuse on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby supports the creation of a Core Planning Team to be comprised of the White Mountain Apache Police Department, the Rainbow Treatment Center, the Tribal Planning Department and other pertinent key departments.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby authorizes the White Mountain Apache Tribal Police Department's submittal of an application to the U.S. Department of Justice, Indian Alcohol and Substance Abuse Demonstration Program in the amount of \$350,000 on behalf of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby authorizes the Chairman, and in his absence, the Vice-Chairman to sign any and all necessary documents related to this resolution in FY 2002 and FY2003.

The foregoing resolution was on June 6, 2002 duly adopted by a vote of SIX for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (c), (d), (f), (h), (i), (j), (k), (s), (t), and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
