

**RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Branch of Roads Program has developed necessary street improvements and construction plans for the community of McNary entitled BIA Project F.A.I.R. Consolidated No. 27; and

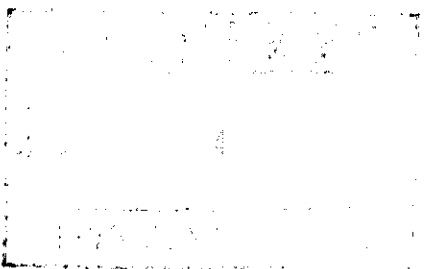
WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Branch of Roads Program has identified appropriate funds to accomplish the street construction and improvement plan, with scheduled time frames of implementation; and

WHEREAS, the residents of the community of McNary have publicly criticized the disruptive nature to their community that construction and improvement activities bring, such as muddy, dirty streets, cars and conditions in the winter and poor air quality from cinders and dust in the summer; and


WHEREAS, the McNary community believes it best for the health, safety and welfare of its members that the time frame for road construction projects be placed for initiation and completion prior to the summer and winter season for the reasons stated above.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby requests that the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Branch of Roads Program to reschedule BIA Project F.A.I.R. Consolidated No. 27 of McNary to occur during the spring or fall seasons to prevent undue hardship on family traffic in the McNary community, and that the scheduling be done at the earliest available time with notice to the Tribal Council of the new schedule.

The foregoing resolution was on March 20, 2003 duly adopted by a vote of SEVEN for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (s), (t), and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
