

**RESOLUTION OF THE

FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

WHEREAS, the Tribal Wildlife and Outdoor Recreation Division has come before the Tribal Council this date and requested approval of the Outdoor Recreation Regulations for 2003, copies of which are attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has reviewed recommended changes to the Outdoor Recreation Regulations designed to provide sustainable use of Tribal recreational and natural resources; and


WHEREAS, the recreational-use seasons, prices, possession limits, prohibitions and regulations are based on sound biological, business, and sustainable use principles; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that the Outdoor Recreation Regulations for 2003, as amended herein, be approved by the Tribal Council.


BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves the attached Outdoor Recreation Regulations for 2003, as amended therein.

The foregoing resolution was on March 21, 2003 duly adopted by a vote of NINE for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (f), (h), (i), (s), (t), and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

- **RENT-A-LAKE: HURRICANE LAKE AND CYCLONE LAKE**
These two lakes will be open to the public after the TROPHY ELK HUNTS, dates will be October 9, 2003 till December 31, 2003. No camping. Tribal members do not need a permit at this time and non-members will need to have a fishing license in possession.

The department will also be putting out a one to two page regulations for tribal members. (No permits required or fees, only in special use managed lakes and streams.)
