

**RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

**WHEREAS,** the Tribal Council in Resolution 06-2000-163 authorized District I Council Members at that time to review and take corrective actions concerning problems with administration at the Cibecue Complex; and

**WHEREAS,** District I Council Member Jacob Henry has now assumed the Council seat formerly held by Judy Dehose; and

**WHEREAS,** Mr. Jacob Henry and Mr. Ronnie Lupe have reviewed current concerns about the delivery of services to the Cibecue community; and

**WHEREAS,** the District I Council representatives recommend a modification to the authority granted under Resolution 06-2000-163 to authorize the District I Council representatives to review, evaluate, and establish policies for all Tribal services provided in the Cibecue area, including services provided through the Cibecue Commercial Center and other enterprises of the Tribe; and

**WHEREAS,** the District I Council representatives would seek to provide input and coordinate with existing department directors and administrative managers to improve services and better coordinate the existing services to meet the needs of Cibecue residents.

**BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby rescinds Resolution 06-2000-163 and determines that District I Council Members, Mr. Ronnie Lupe and Mr. Jacob Henry, are authorized to review, evaluate, and recommend alterations to existing policy for Tribal departments, programs and enterprises serving the Cibecue community, including the Cibecue School Board, with the goal of coordinating and tailoring services to better serve residents of Cibecue and ensure that accountability and effective performance standards guide the work being provided through these important Tribal offices and programs.

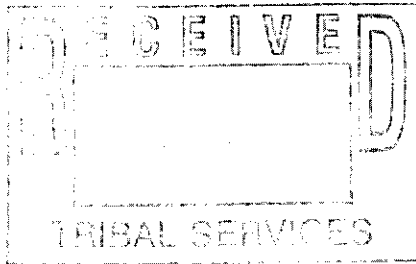
**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that such authority shall be on an on-going basis until later modified by the Council and is intended to coordinate existing services rather than create new administrative power over such programs with the intent of better serving the needs of the people of Cibecue.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it will evaluate and move on recommended changes from Councilmen Lupe and Henry when notified thereof.


The foregoing resolution was on May 20, 2003 duly adopted by a vote of SEVEN for, ZERO against and ONE abstention by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (s), (t), and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe,
