

**RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

WHEREAS, the Tribal Wildlife & Outdoor Recreation Division has come before the Tribal Council this date and requested approval for the Non-Tribal Member Trophy Elk Auction Hunt season dates to be changed from "any seven (7) days between September 16 through October 8, 2003," approved by Tribal Resolution number 04-2003-131, to September 11 through September 17, 2003; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has reviewed the attached justification for the proposed changes to the Non-Tribal Member Trophy Elk Auction Hunt season dates; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that the Non-Tribal Member Trophy Elk Auction Hunt season dates, as amended herein, be approved by the Tribal Council.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves the change of the Non-Tribal Member Trophy Elk Auction Hunt season dates as amended herein.


The foregoing resolution was on September 9, 2003 duly adopted by a vote of EIGHT for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (f), (h), (s), (t), and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
