

**RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

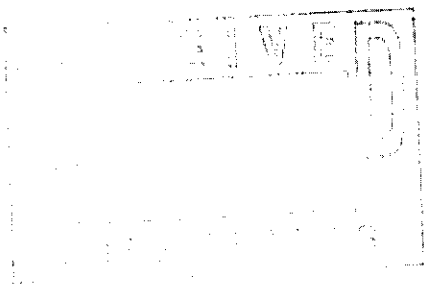
WHEREAS, Becky Ethelbah on behalf of Johns Hopkins University Pathways has approached the Tribal Council this date with a request that the Tribal Council approve the following Pathways manuscript for publication: **Food Insecurity and Its Relationship to Socioeconomic Status and Obesity in Apache Women and their Preschool Children;** and


WHEREAS, this manuscript examines the prevalence of food insecurity and the relationship of food insecurity to socioeconomic variables and weight status. A high prevalence of household food insecurity and obesity co-existed; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that it should grant approval to have the **Food Insecurity and Its Relations to Socioeconomic Status and Obesity in Apache Women and their Preschool Children** manuscript published.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves for publication of the manuscript: **Food Insecurity and Its Relations to Socioeconomic Status and Obesity in Apache Women and their Preschool Children.**

The foregoing resolution was on September 9, 2003 duly adopted by a vote of SEVEN for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (g), (s), (t), and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
