

**RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

**WHEREAS,** the Tribal Council on this date has heard concerns about the hiring and selection process at Hondah Casino as well as the enforcement of the grievance procedures; and

**WHEREAS,** these concerns center on the conduct of the casino personnel director and raise questions as to the compliance with Tribal law and policy in the orderly processing of forms for the hiring and promoting of employees; and

**WHEREAS,** the Tribal Council has determined that this matter needs review with a report back to the Tribal Council; and


**WHEREAS,** during the period of the review the Tribal Council directs that the personnel director be placed on paid leave to allow the review and investigation to proceed without the appearance of interference.

**BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs that investigation be made into the selection, recruitment, and hiring process at the Hondah Resort and Casino to assure the process is in compliance with Tribal policies and not discriminatory.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it directs that during the period of the investigation the Hondah Resort and Casino personnel director be placed on paid administrative leave.

The foregoing resolution was on OCTOBER 15, 2003 duly adopted by a vote of EIGHT for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (h), (i), (s), (t), and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
