

**RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

**WHEREAS,** the Tribe has received word that Tribal public safety agencies, including the Fire Department and Police Department may be eligible to receive Homeland Security funding through Navajo County through a grant agreement Navajo County has signed with the State of Arizona, Division of Emergency Management and the U.S. Department of Justice; and

**WHEREAS,** the Tribe has been invited to enter into an IGA with Navajo County which would make the Tribe eligible to participate in the distribution of Homeland Security funds; and


**WHEREAS,** the Tribe must notify the County by Monday, December 15 whether it agrees to participate in the agreement for purposes of the Homeland Security funding.

**BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby authorizes Acting Police Chief Billy Kahn on behalf of the Tribal Police Department and Fire Chief Paul Kuehl on behalf of the Tribal Fire Department to enter into intergovernmental agreements between Navajo County and the Tribe on behalf of the Police Department and the Fire Department to participate in the potential distribution of Homeland Security funding as it becomes available.

The foregoing resolution was on DECEMBER 15, 2003 duly adopted by a vote of NINE for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (b), (j), (s), (t), and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
