RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has received notice this day that several tribal members have concerns about the progress of cases they have filed within the Tribal Court of the White Mountain Apache Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council finds that it should meet with the Tribal Court to determine its progress in resolving concerns expressed in reports and audits conducted through the Bureau of Indian Affairs.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs the Chief Judge and whomever he wishes to invite from his staff to provide a general program update to the Tribal Council on the Court, with specific identification of the Court's plan of action to resolve findings made in the Bureau of Indian Affairs' review and audit conducted through Ron McGee in 2002.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>SEPTEMBER 9, 2004</u> duly adopted by a vote of <u>SIX</u> for, <u>ZERO</u> against, and <u>ONE</u> abstention by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (i), (s), (t), and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
