- WHEREAS, the Nations Come Alive Conference will provide a forum to discuss topics important to Native people, including, child abuse, domestic violence, HIV infection, substance abuse, suicide, grief and worship; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council did find that the Conference in the best interest of members of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it supports the Nations Come Alive Conference of January 21-23, 2005, in Tucson, Arizona, and encourages members to attend.
