

**RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

(Requesting Removal of Bureau of Indian Affairs Criminal Investigator Daniel Hawkins)

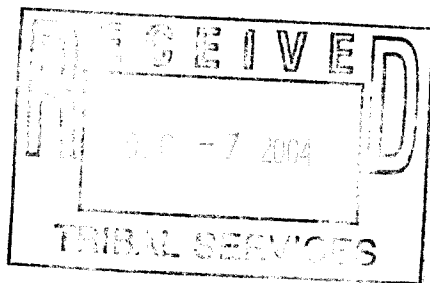
WHEREAS, coordination of criminal investigations between the Bureau of Indian Affairs Office of Law Enforcement and the White Mountain Apache Tribal Police Department is essential for effective law enforcement and a necessary part of government-to-government relations; and


WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has come to understand that Daniel Hawkins, Criminal Investigator for the BIA Fort Apache Agency has not effectively coordinated criminal investigations with Tribal Police Department; and


WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of law enforcement and government-to-government relations that Criminal Investigator Daniel Hawkins be removed from the BIA Fort Apache Agency and provided an assignment elsewhere within the Bureau of Indian Affairs Office of Law Enforcement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby requests that the Bureau of Indian Affairs immediately remove Criminal Investigator Daniel Hawkins from the Fort Apache Agency and reassign Mr. Hawkins to another position within the Bureau of Indian Affairs Office of Law Enforcement and off of the lands of the Fort Apache Reservation.

The foregoing resolution was on NOVEMBER 8, 2004 duly adopted by a vote of SIX for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (b), (c), (h), (i), (j), (k), (l), (t), and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
