

RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

(Approving publication of manuscript from the Johns Hopkins University titled, "Safety and Efficacy of Pentavalent Human-Bovine (WC3) Reassortant Rotavirus Vaccine in Preventing Rotavirus Gastroenteritis and Associated Healthcare Contacts")

- WHEREAS, members of the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe are duly elected representatives of the people and their respective districts; and among their many concerns are the health and well-being of its Tribal Members; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council supports carefully designed research projects to evaluate health problems which exist in the population and to develop appropriate interventions which seek to decrease or alleviate these problems; and
- WHEREAS, Johns Hopkins is requesting permission to publish a manuscript titled, "Safety and Efficacy of Pentavalent Human-Bovine (WC3) Reassortant Rotavirus Vaccine in Preventing Rotavirus Gastroenteritis and Associated Healthcare Contacts" by Johns Hopkins personnel. The manuscript reports on the large international study of rotavirus vaccine. It includes data from the Navajo and White Mountain Apache Tribes.
- **WHEREAS,** the manuscript, if approved, will be submitted for publication in the New England Journal of Medicine.
- **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves that the manuscript be submitted for publication.

The foregoing resolution was on November 9, 2005, duly adopted by a vote of SIX for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to the authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (b), (j), (k), (s), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
