**RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

**(Approving An Application For Fiscal Year 2006 Trails Heritage Fund Assistance Grant)**

**WHEREAS**, the 1993 Master Plan for the Fort Apache Historic Park calls for the development of trails to serve community members and visitors; and

**WHEREAS**, the legislature under A.R.S. 41-503 has authorized the establishment of the Trails Heritage Fund program, providing funds to the State of Arizona, its political subdivisions and Indian Tribes for developing non-motorized trails and facilities for public use; and

**WHEREAS**, the adopted procedures established by the State Parks Board require the applicant to certify by resolution the approval of applications, signature authorization, the availability of local matching funds and authorization to sign a Participant Agreement with the Board prior to submission of said applicants to the Board; and

**WHEREAS**, after careful consideration and review, the Tribal Council finds the application for the Fiscal Year 2006 Trails Heritage Fund Assistance Grant to be in the best interests of the Tribe.

**BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe hereby:


1. Approves the filing of an application for FY06 Trails Heritage Fund assistance; and
2. Certifies that the application is consistent and compatible with all adopted plans and programs of the White Mountain Apache Tribe for non-motorized trails and facility development; and
3. Agrees to comply with all appropriate procedures, guidelines, and requirements established by the State Parks Board as a part of the application process; and
4. Certifies that the White Mountain Apache Tribe Heritage Program will comply with all appropriate state and federal regulations, policies, guidelines, and requirements as they relate to the application; and
5. Certifies matching funds totaling no less than \$29,503.00 are available from the Heritage Program and from diverse community programs; and
6. Appoints the Tribe's Historic Preservation Officer as agent of the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council to conduct all negotiations, execute and submit all documents including, but


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not limited to, applications, agreements, amendments, billing statements, and so on, which may be necessary for the completion of the aforementioned project.

7. Directs that any and all agreements thereto be subject to review and approval by the Legal Department.
8. Authorizes the Tribal Historic Preservation Officer to receive and expend any and all funds related to the Trails Heritage Fund, subject to the terms and conditions of the grant and according to a budget therefore

The foregoing resolution was on February 8, 2005, duly adopted by a vote of FIVE for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to the authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (b), (f), (g), (i), (j), (s), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
