**RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

(Directing WMAPD to Establish a Rotation of Towing Calls)

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 1(a) of the Constitution of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, *inter alia*, the Tribal Council has the authority to represent the Tribe and act in all matters that concern the welfare of the Tribe; and

WHEREAS, N'Dee Auto Body did present a concern to the Tribal Council about the calls for towing services made by the White Mountain Apache Police Department at an vehicle accident scene; and

WHEREAS, N'Dee Auto Body did meet with the Legal Department and Twin Rivers Towing Company in an attempt to establish a system for the rotation of towing calls by WMAPD; and



WHEREAS, an agreement was reached in which each towing company would submit its documentation (license, inspection and insurance), and that a per call rotation would occur, subject to crime scene investigation requirements and the wishes of the vehicle owners; and

WHEREAS, N'Dee Auto Body alleges that it has not received any calls for towing services, despite the agreements; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council finds that a daily rotation of calls by the WMAPD for towing services between towing companies would be a fair distribution of demand for such services.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council that the WMAPD establish a daily rotation of calls for towing services between the towing companies owned by members of the Tribe operating on the lands of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

The foregoing resolution was on March 8, 2006, duly adopted by a vote of EIGHT for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to the authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (i), (s), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
