

RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

(Requesting WMAPD to Complete Policies and Procedures for K-9 Drug Interdiction)

- WHEREAS, pursuant to Article IV, Section 1(a) of the Constitution of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, *inter alia*, the Tribal Council has the authority to represent the Tribe and act in all matters that concern the welfare of the Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, the WMAPD has provided an officer to the Whiteriver Unified School District No. 20 (WUSD), Patricia Nosie; and
- WHEREAS, WUSD has purchased a dog who is eligible to work as a K-9 Drug Interdiction Unit, known as Cola, which WUSD would like to donate to WMAPD; and
- WHEREAS, Officer Nose and Cola are not presently certified for K-9 Drug Interdiction, and WMAPD has not completed policies and procedures for such activity; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council finds that a K-9 Drug Interdiction Unit would be in the best interests of making the schools safe from drugs.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that:

- 1. WMAPD is hereby requested to complete the necessary policies and procedures for K-9 Drug Interdiction.
- 2. The Legal Department is hereby directed to review said policies and procedures, and negotiate an intergovernmental agreement with WUSD for the purpose of coordinating K-9 Drug Interdiction..

The foregoing resolution was on June 8, 2006, duly adopted by a vote of <u>EIGHT</u> for and <u>ZERO</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to the authority vested in it by Article IV, Section 1 (a), (b), (s), (t) and (u) of the Constitution of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe September 30, 1993, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on November 12, 1993, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
